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

Advent is here and Christmas is just around the corner. Time to get busy preparing for the holiday season. You have heard it a million times to slow down, stay focused on the "reason for the season" (Jesus) and prepare your hearts for the celebration of his birth.

I know all of this sounds like a broken record and as we get older it is easy to turn down the volume on the message, but what if we look at Advent in a different way? What if we look at Advent as a journey we are on instead of set of tasks and errands we need to run.
